

SERVICE, SAFETY, and RECREATION COMMITTEE
Monday, October 6, 2008

The Service, Safety and Recreation Committee met in the 2nd Floor Conference Room of 105 North Main Street on Monday, October 6, 2008 at 8:00 A.M. Mr. Steve Jennings presided and those in attendance were; Mr. Dale Lynch, Council Member, Mr. Dwight Hedrick, Council Member; Mr. Ted Hawk, Council Member, Mr. Ben Roby, Council Chairman; Mr. Joe Denen, City Manager; Mr. Joe Burbage, Service Director; Mr. Jim Heath, Assistant Service Director, Mr. Dan Fowler, Fire Chief, Mr. Tom Youtz, Assistant Fire Director; Mr. Brian Hottinger, Police Chief, Mr. Mark Pitstick, City Attorney and Mr. Charlie Chaplain, representative of the All American Fire Equipment.

1. The Committee benefited from a general report of the Washington Fire Department. Chief Folwer addressed the Committee regarding the need for two fire vehicles. The Committee reviewed purchase specifications and term for both vehicles from the Rosenbauer Company presented by All American Fire Company. No decision was made at this time by the Committee.
2. The Committee benefited from a general report of the Washington Police Department.
3. The Committee benefited from a review of the Fayette County Dog Warden Incident report for the month ending on September 30, 2008. There were no questions of the report.
4. The Committee benefited from a review of the Police & Fire Building by Mr. Joe Denen.
5. The Administration advised the Committee that there were no salt bids received. Mr. Denen stated that the Administration currently had 300 tons of salt in stock at this time which is the equivalent use for two decent snows.
6. The Committee benefited from a review of the water reserve assessment. The Administration advised the Committee that the reserve would be reviewed weekly, although noted no concerns at this time.
7. The Committee was advised that an interior inspection had been completed to the North Street water tank and no issues were noted.
8. The Committee was advised that the Temple Street Reconstruction Project was progressing well.
9. The Committee noted that the Columbarium would be set at the Washington Cemetery within the current week. The Committee was advised that the Columbarium would contain 120 units.
