

SERVICE, SAFETY, and RECREATION COMMITTEE

Monday, November 3, 2008

The Service, Safety and Recreation Committee met in the 2nd Floor Conference Room of 105 North Main Street on Monday, November 3, 2008 at 8:00 A.M. Mr. Steve Jennings presided and those in attendance were; Mr. Dale Lynch, Council Member, Mr. Dwight Hedrick, Council Member; Mr. Ted Hawk, Council Member, Mr. Ben Roby, Council Chairman; Mr. Joe Denen, City Manager; Mr. Joe Burbage, Service Director; Mr. Dan Fowler, Fire Chief; Mr. Brian Hottinger, Police Chief, and Mr. Mark Pitstick, City Attorney.

1. The Committee benefited from a general report of the Washington Fire Department.
2. The Committee benefited from a general report of the Washington Police Department. The Committee inquired about truck and trailer parking rules within City Limit.
3. The Committee benefited from a review of the Fayette County Dog Warden Incident report for the month ending on October 31, 2008. There were no questions of the report.
4. The Committee benefited from a review of the Police & Fire Building by Mr. Joe Denen. Mr. Denen advised that the construction was progressing well.
5. The Committee recommended that the Administration seek permission to rebid road salt for the upcoming year.
6. The Committee benefited from a review of the water reserve assessment.
7. The Committee was advised that the Temple Street Reconstruction Project was completed.
8. The Administration advised the Committee that the Belle-Aire Lift Station was progressing.
9. The Committee benefited from a review of the Fel-Mar Subdivision progression and ODOT's recommendation for the development.
10. The Administration advised the Committee of the response from the Ohio EPA regarding the SECAP Implementation Plan. The Committee noted that the Ohio EPA did not request additional items although concerns regarding the Leesburg Avenue project were noted. The Committee also noted and conflict with Ohio EPA regarding the schedule of improvements.
11. The Committee recommended that the 4 way flasher be removed permanently from the intersection at Lewis and Temple. The Committee noted that the intersection would remain a 4 way stop.
12. The Committee benefited from a review of the pool operations recommendations. The Administration advised the Committee that discussions were continuing. No additions or questions were noted.
