

**SERVICE, SAFETY, and RECREATION COMMITTEE**  
**Monday, December 1, 2008**

The Service, Safety and Recreation Committee met in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor Conference Room of 105 North Main Street on Monday, December 1, 2008 at 8:00 A.M. Mr. Steve Jennings presided and those in attendance were; Mr. Dale Lynch, Council Member, Mr. Dwight Hedrick, Council Member; Mr. Ted Hawk, Council Member, Mr. Ben Roby, Council Chairman; Mr. Joe Denen, City Manager; Mr. Joe Burbage, Service Director; Mr. Jim Heath, Assistant Service Director; Mr. Brian Hottinger, Police Chief, and Mr. Mark Pitstick, City Attorney.

1. The Committee benefited from a general report of the Washington Police Department.
2. The Committee benefited from a review of the Fayette County Dog Warden Incident report for the month ending on November 30, 2008.
3. The Committee benefited from a review of the Police & Fire Building by Mr. Joe Denen. Mr. Denen advised that the construction was progressing well.
4. The Committee benefited from a review of the water reserve assessment. Mr. Denen stated that if no more rain is received within the next month, a conservation notice be needed.
5. The Committee benefited from a review of the Temple Street Reconstruction Project.
6. The Committee discussed issues regarding the 4 way flashers at Temple and Lewis. The Committee recommended that the 4 way flasher be removed permanently from the intersection. The Committee noted that the intersection would remain a 4 way stop.
7. The Committee recommended the shelter reservations fee increase from \$20.00 to a \$30.00 non-refundable fee.
8. The Committee reviewed a letter from the Department of Health concerning a new mandate from the BGB Act regarding pool drain covers. The Administration advised the Committee that new pool drains would need to be purchased as mandated by the new law.
9. The Committee was advised that an engineer would review the five-point intersection regarding possible expansion and right turn lane addition to State Route 41 South.
10. The Committee was advised of a request from a citizen regarding no parking on East Street, between North and Market, on December 19<sup>th</sup> from 4pm to 10 pm. The Committee recommended to proceed with the request, but noted that a limited number of signs are in the possession of the City.
