

SERVICE, SAFETY, and RECREATION COMMITTEE

Monday, October 5, 2009

The Service, Safety and Recreation Committee met in the 2nd Floor Conference Room of 105 North Main Street on Monday, October 5, 2010 2009 at 8:00 A.M. Mr. Dale Lynch presided and those in attendance were; Mr. Ben Roby, Council Chairman; Mr. Dwight Hedrick, Council Member, Mr. Ted Hawk, Council Member, Mr. Dwight Hedrick, Council Member, Mr. Joe Denen, City Manager, Mr. Dan Fowler, Fire Chief, Mr. Joe Burbage, Service Director, Mr. Jim Heath, Assistant Service Director, Mr. Mark Pitstick, City Attorney, Mr. Rob Hedrick, Economic Development Director, Mrs. Susan McDaniel, citizen, and Mr. Daryl Robert a representative from the Multivista Company.

1. Mr. Rob Hedrick and Mrs. Susan McDaniel, addressed the Committee on behalf of the Alliance for Prosperous Downtown (APD), and presented a slideshow regarding the "Clean Sweep" program. Mr. Hedrick addressed issues regarding the maintenance, zoning and overall esthetics of the downtown area and encouraged a cooperative movement of all departments for improvement and growth to the downtown area. The Committee requested that a quarterly update of the APD Committee be given at a Safety, Service and Recreation meeting.
2. Mr. Darrell Roberts, a representative from MultiVista Construction Documentation Company, presented a power point demonstration regarding the documentation of construction projects.
3. The Committee benefited from a review of the general report of the Washington Fire no negative and Police Departments. Lieutenant Ruth advised the Committee that the Police Department had not received any negative reports nor noted any increase in traffic accidents, due to the traffic signal project completed on Court Street.
4. The Committee benefited from a review of the Police & Fire Building by Mr. Joe Denen. The Committee noted that a building tour would be completed on Tuesday, October 6th at 3pm. The Committee benefited from a review of the Open House and Dedication Committee. The Committee recommended that an open house for the public to attend be scheduled on November 15, 2009 from 2 pm to 5 pm.
5. The Committee benefited from a review of the Fayette County Dog Warden Incident report for the month of September.
6. The Committee recommended the option of rerouting semi-truck traffic from the downtown Court Street area be pursued.
7. The Committee benefited from a review of all current city projects. The Committee noted that all projects were progressing on schedule.
8. The Committee recommended that legislation be brought to Council regarding the North Street Bridge Deck Project.
9. The Committee recommended that the Administration seek permission to bid for the Leesburg Avenue Right-of-Way project.
